

Code Enforcement activities have moved to Section 4 of the City, also known as the Art District which generally extends south from Gulfport Boulevard to the water and west from 49th Street to 58th & 59th Streets South.

There were Code Enforcement 182 cases for May 2012, and a total of 1,684 to date for 2012. There were 25 citizen complaints which represent 13.7 percent of the case load for May, and 130 to date for 2012, a ratio of 7.7 percent. Because the City has one inspector who focuses on one section at a time, we depend on residents to call in violations when they see them. We will inspect within one working day of a complaint to verify any violation. Please call (727) 893-1061 if you see violations. If the inspector is unavailable, leave as detailed a message as possible to help us find the violation. Complaints can be anonymous, but if you want a follow-up you will have to leave contact information which means the complaint is no longer anonymous.

Officers responded to Southwest Pinellas Storage on the afternoon of June 28 after the manager reported that a storage trailer was broken into sometime after closing time on June 27. Nothing appeared to have been taken.

Officers charged a juvenile with Trespass and Violation of Probation after he was seen in the Skate Park after curfew on the evening of June 28.

Officers responded the 5300 block of 7th Avenue on the evening of June 28 for a check on a juvenile on probation with a 7 p.m. curfew. The juvenile was not home and further investigation revealed he was not at the location his mother claimed. He was arrested later the same evening.

On the afternoon of June 29 a student reported that she was followed from Stetson University to Fazio's Pizza. The subject was described as a dark-skinned black male in his early-mid 30s with a low cut afro, a "pop-eyed look" and possibly a Haitian accent. He spoke briefly with the victim in the pizza shop, saying she should get to know him better, and she declined. He then tried to claim a dollar bill he picked up from the floor belonged to her, but she declined to take it.

Residents in the 4700 block of Baywood Point called GPD in the early morning hours of June 30 to report that two males attempting to break into their home. A silver Saturn SUV sped out of the driveway as Officer Horning arrived on the scene, and he was unable to turn his vehicle around fast enough to pursue. Several doors of the home had multiple pry marks where the subjects attempted to enter the home. The home next door was burglarized the next evening while the owners were on vacation. Investigators theorize that the burglars targeted the wrong house during the first attempt.

Officers responded to Southwest Pinellas Storage on the morning of June 30 after the manager reported that 17 storage units had been broken into overnight. An investigation continues.

Officers responded to Gulfport Liquors on the morning of June 30 after the clerk reported that Janet Trumpy was drunk and asking customers for money. When Officer Horning made contact with her she was sitting in her wheelchair in the middle of Gulfport Boulevard drinking a beer. She was arrested.

While assisting PCSO with locating a domestic violence suspect on the evening of June 30, officers were involved in a foot pursuit and capture of the suspect. The foot chase started on 51st Street & 23rd Avenue and ended at 51st Street & 20th Avenue, and included spanning three eight-foot high chain link fences at Gulfport Elementary School. The suspect was charged with Burglary to an Unoccupied Structure, Resisting without Violence and Possession of a Controlled Substance.

Officers responded to Southwest Pinellas Storage on the morning of July 2 after the manager reported that 6 additional units were burglarized during the night. The investigation continues.

Officers are investigating a Fraud case after a complainant in the 5400 block of Shore Boulevard reported that an unknown subject picked up the complainant's debit card and used it at least 4 times.
