



## **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING CITY OF GULFPORT, FLORIDA**

In accordance with the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gulfport, Florida, notice is hereby given that the Planning and Zoning Board/Local Planning Agency will conduct a Public Hearing on the following Right-of-Way Vacation Application during their regularly scheduled meeting of Wednesday, March 6, 2019, which convenes at 6:30 p.m., in the City Hall, City Council Chambers, 2401 53<sup>rd</sup> Street South, Gulfport, Florida.

### **1. Application #AV18-01: Heather and Marcel Hills (Owners/Applicants)**

Application for Vacation of Public Right-Of-Way: A portion of that certain alley lying East of and adjacent to Lots 11, 12, 13 and 14, Disston Avenue Subdivision of Gulfport, according to the map or plat thereof as recorded in Plat Book 5, Page 3, public records of Pinellas County, Florida, being bounded on the North by the Easterly extension of the South line of the North 20 feet of said lot 14 and bounded on the South by the Westerly extension of the North line of Lot 8 of said Disston Avenue Subdivision of Gulfport.

### **Right-Of-Way Vacation Application Request:**

Application for Vacation of Public Right-Of-Way, City Ordinance to vacate the remaining portion of the existing North-South Alley between 50th and 51st Streets South, and South of 24th Avenue South.

The City Council will also conduct Public Hearings on the Application during the regularly scheduled city council meetings of Tuesday, March 19 and April 2, 2019 which will convene at 7:00 p.m. in the City Hall, City Council Chambers, 2401 53<sup>rd</sup> Street South, Gulfport, Florida.

Any person wishing to speak regarding the application will be given an opportunity to do so at the hearings. Any person who decides to appeal any decision of the Planning and Zoning Board/Local Planning Agency or the City Council/Community Redevelopment Agency with respect to any matter considered at this meeting will need a record of the proceedings, and for such purposes may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. The law does not require the City Clerk to transcribe verbatim minutes. Therefore, the applicant must make the necessary arrangements with a private reporter or private reporting firm and bear the resulting expense.
